Thanks to her long, curly hair, Kathy grew up known as Cork—or Corky Moore. The nickname started as "*Corkilini*," given to her by a childhood friend's dad, and it stuck throughout her school years. It became so well known that even her principal called her Corky.

Kathy's family moved from Seattle to the small town of Gold Bar, Washington, in 1962. The second of five siblings, she grew up hunting birds with her dad and their black Labs, fishing, and enjoying everything the outdoors had to offer.

At Sultan High School, Kathy was a cheerleader, a track athlete, and a tournament trap shooter. After graduating in 1971, she continued her love of sports by playing both women's and co-ed softball. Her primary team, Index Air, took her to Hawaii each year to compete in tournaments against other teams sponsored by airlines. *"We were a really good team and had a lot of fun!"*

Her passion for softball continued later in life. Kathy played competitive softball for 18 consecutive years while working two and sometimes three jobs.

Another lifelong passion has been the restaurant industry. Kathy began working at the Dutch Cup Restaurant in Sultan in 1967 and cooked there on and off for 15 years. Since then, she's owned three restaurants that local residents still fondly remember.

This year, Kathy was honored with the Citizen of the Year Award in recognition of her outstanding dedication to the people of Sky Valley and her decades of caring for those around her. Receiving this honor during America's 250th anniversary year makes the recognition even more meaningful.

When she's not traveling with her significant other, Terry, or visiting her daughter Nicki, son-in-law, and three wonderful grandchildren in Montana, Kathy can usually be found preparing delicious homemade lunches at the Sky Valley Center or taking care of her Airbnb in Index. She shares: "The Center brings people together for friendship, food and functions. It is an important part of people's life."

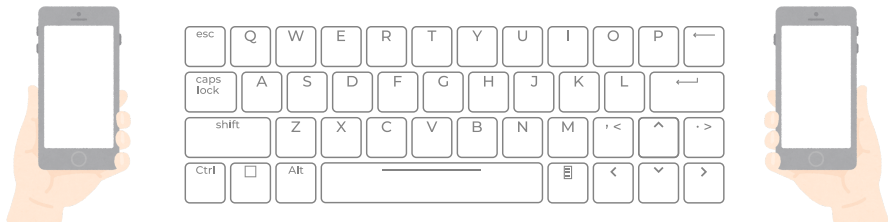

Facebook privacy tips: In the mobile app, go to Settings > Tools and resources > Privacy Checkup. There you can see your posts, profile details and how people can find you. Update anything that looks too public. Liked or commented on something you regret? Go to Settings & privacy > Activity log > Your Facebook activity. From there, you can see past comments, delete them or unlike posts. You also can clear posts you’ve watched or interacted with.

Next time a video is playing, on Roku, press the star button on your remote, then head to Sound settings > Customize sound mode and turn on Volume leveling. In Amazon Prime Video, tap the speech-bubble icon, then Audio & Subtitles > English Dialogue Boost: High. Netflix hides a similar option under Audio > English (Original).
