## GIPSON PROFILE | Debi Gardner



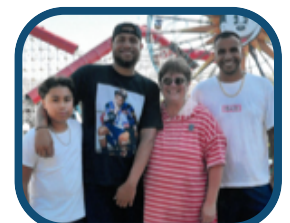
Debi had melanoma before, but this was different. The lump she'd first dismissed had grown from the winter of 2018 to the fall of 2020, in the middle of the first Covid year. Breast cancer, the doctor confirmed. Which led Debi down a lonely path: a lumpectomy in January, harsh chemo from February to July, radiation in August, and then milder chemo until February 2022. For most of these endless procedures and appointments, her husband Ernest couldn't enter the hospital, had to drop her off in front to respect the pandemic protocols.

But there was one exception, which became some of Debi's favorite memories. *"My chemo sessions were six hours long, and I was allowed to bring a friend with me. We just sat and talked and had a great time, ordered lunch to be delivered from anywhere we wanted. The nurses kept the door open because they loved to hear us laugh."*

Debi recovered from that curve ball life had thrown at her, as she had before.

*"My Dad Brian left us in New Mexico. I don't remember it. I was 18 months old and my Mom was pregnant with my brother."*

Debi wouldn't hear from her father for another 25 years.

Frances Gardner, now a single, pregnant mom and the first divorcee in her family, drove north, landing in Seattle to live for a time with her Uncle's friends. Soon Debi had a baby brother named Robert, and the time in Seattle stretched from days and weeks to months and years.

The Gardners lived with two different families near Woodland Park Zoo, then moved to a boarding house on Capitol Hill owned by the Haas family, who rented rooms to single mothers. Frances needed to work or attend school, and the Haas home provided 24-hour childcare. By the time Debi was in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade and Robert in 1<sup>st</sup>, they'd moved back to their old neighborhood by the zoo. With Frances working full time, Debi and Robert became latch key kids, getting themselves ready for B.F. Day Elementary each morning. *"We knew when JP Patches was over we had to leave for school."*

What could have been a troubled childhood of transitions was instead, to the young Debi Gardner, an enchanted adventure, as the young kids around her needed caring for. And Debi was the one to do it. *"I was always teaching school in the house, taking care of kids."*

Debi was a natural leader, an attentive student, and a caring big sister to all the boys and girls who came and went in her neighborhood. After school, when she wasn't taking care of her brother or other kids *"... I liked to ride my bike, hang out with my friends. One of my friend's dad owned Dez's Tavern by the Seattle Center, and we'd go clean it for free pizza."*

While attending Lincoln High School, a teacher recommended Debi to work at nearby Wallingford Day Care, and at 17 years-old Debi found her calling: doing as a career what she'd been doing all along: caring for and nurturing preschoolers.

Throughout the next decades Debi served in teacher, cook and administrator positions at KinderCare, University of Washington, Virginia Mason, Indigo, and Kids Country, where she stayed for 18 years. Burned out on administering early childhood centers, in 2018 Debi took a part time position as a Cook at Building Kidz Learning Center. By December she'd been named the Director.

Meanwhile Debi began her own family. She first met Ernest at a club in downtown Seattle. Having served four years in the Army, the young man from Memphis, Tennessee, had gotten on at Bethlehem Steel. He was a soldier, he was cute, and he was persistent, and five years later they welcome their first son Jelani in 1989. Little brother Mario arrived in 1991, and the family lived in apartments until Debi's 36th birthday, when Ernest drove Debi to a new development in Everett, parked outside a brand-new house with a SOLD sign in front, and told her that *"... we can move in in two weeks."* It belonged to them, and it still does today.

Reflecting on her life, Debi remembers the day she got a letter from her father. When she was 27-years-old. He'd just gotten out of prison again – having been mixed up in Louisiana with the mob and drugs – and he wanted to get to know his children. He flew Debi and Robert out to South Carolina, the first of a number of trips Debi spent visiting her father. Frances, who had never disparaged her ex, even invited him out to Seattle for Thanksgiving. Brian died within 10 years of sending that letter to his daughter, and Debi is nothing but grateful for the time she spent with him.

In 2022 Debi retired for good, and needed something or someone to look after, besides her grandson Xavier. She began with trips at the Carl Gipson Center, and then started taking group exercise classes, three back-to-back a day. *"I felt welcomed. It didn't matter than I couldn't do some of the exercises."*

Soon new friends invited her to lunch, and she joined the Celebrations Committee, putting on big events. Later she joined, and then became the Chair of, our Senior Advisory Committee. But it's the GOAL Program's Tuesday café that sets her eyes twinkling. *"It's been one of the most amazing experiences. Those students are so friendly, so appreciative. I love working in the café."*

*"I've got a new purpose. I've made friends. We get together, check on each other, know when someone is having surgery, and let them know that they're still loved and missed. It's a real community here."*

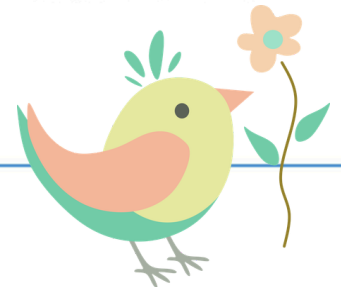

**Tech Bytes**  
with Jim Hagglund

**Your phone is a snitch:** Every app you download wants to track your digital footprint to sell to advertisers. If you're tired of seeing so many "targeted" ads, turn it off. On iPhone, go to **Settings > Privacy & Security > Tracking** and toggle off **Allow Apps to Request to Track**. On Android, go to **Settings > Google > Ads** and hit **Delete advertising ID**. It takes 10 seconds to stop the stalking.

**Phone on silent and can't find it?** Make it ring anyway. From any browser, head to **iCloud.com/find** (iPhone) or **android.com/find** (Android), sign in and tap Play Sound. It will ring the phone at full volume for two minutes, even if silent mode is on or the ringer is turned off.

**Block this iPhone thief trick:** A thief may be able to swipe open Control Center from the lock screen and flip on Airplane Mode. That cuts off cellular and Wi-Fi, so Find My goes blind. Fix it: Go to **Settings > Face ID & Passcode**, scroll to **Allow Access When Locked** and turn off **Control Center** if it is on.

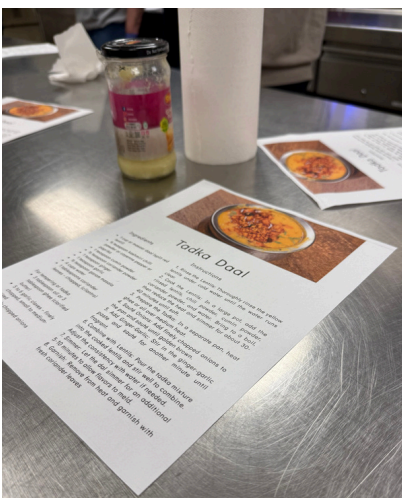
## From Pakistan to Thailand: A Flavorful Adventure with Gul
